- Support FEMA in convening local communities to support recovery efforts.

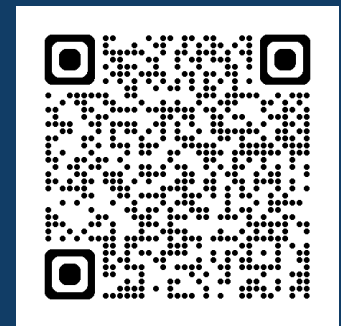
